

Funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act will be dispersed to a number of Federal Agencies, and through these agencies, it will make its way to various State and Local governments, as well as projects and contracts. The list below details which agencies the funding will flow through, and the goals of these projects.*

Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development: \$57.07 Billion

- Department of Transportation: \$57.07 Billion
 - Federal Highway administration: \$27.46 Billion
 - *Repair, construction and other activities*
 - Federal Transit administration: \$8.4 Billion
 - *For construction and maintenance of public transportation systems*
 - Grants for national surface transportation system: \$5.5 Billion
 - *Includes funding for highway and bridge projects and interstate rehabilitation*
 - Federal Railroad Administration: \$3.1 Billion
 - *Includes \$2 Billion for high-speed rail corridor program*
 - Federal Aviation Administration: \$1.3 Billion
 - *Includes installation of runway incursion protection devices*
 - Maritime Administration: \$100 Million
 - *Assistance grants to small shipyards*
- Department of Housing and Urban Development: \$11.6 Billion
 - Public Housing Capital Fund: \$5 Billion
 - *Construction and management funds for public housing agencies*
 - Assisted housing stability and energy and green retrofits: \$2.25 Billion
 - *Includes grants for energy efficiency upgrades and green investments for assisted housing*
 - Home Investment Partnerships Program: \$2.25 Billion
 - *Expand the supply of housing for low-income families*
 - Homelessness Prevention Fund: \$1.5 Billion
 - *Includes funds for assistance with rental and ownership costs*
 - Native American Housing Block Grants: \$510 Million
 - *Grants to Indian tribes for affordable housing projects*
 - Office of Healthy Homes and Lead Hazard Control: \$100 Million
 - *Provides funds to state and local governments to reduce lead-based paint hazards*

 - *Includes grants and assistance with National School Lunch Program equipment*

- Cooperative Services: \$450 Million
 - *Includes loans for biofuel development and renewable energy projects and grants for agriculture, food safety and other research areas*

 - *Includes funding for watershed rehabilitation and flood prevention*

 - *For replacements and upgrades of laboratories and other facilities*

 - *Purchase of property and equipment and renovation of laboratories and other facilities*
- Administration on Aging: \$100 Million

 - Training and Employment Services: \$3.25 Billion
 - State Unemployment Insurance and Employment Service: \$400 Million
 - Office of Job Corps: \$160 Million

Federal and State Government: \$45.472 Billion

- State Fiscal Stabilization Fund: \$39 Billion
 - *Includes funding to restore state education funds to 2008 levels and reduce tuition hikes for higher education*
- Department of the treasury: \$6.335 Billion
 - General Services Administration: \$5.848 Billion
 - *Includes construction and repair of federal buildings and facilities, and purchase of energy efficient vehicles for federal agencies*
 - Community Development Financial Institutions Fund: \$250 Million
 - *Includes grants for economic development and housing assistance in low-income communities*
 - District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority: \$125 Million
 - *Implementation of sewer overflow control plan*
 - Small Business Administration: \$105 Million
 - *Includes loans to small businesses*
